Megan McCaghey, University of Minnesota – St. Paul, MN

Megan is an assistant professor of Plant Pathology at UM. She has a Ph.D. in Plant Pathology from UW-Madison focused on genetic tools for soybean white mold resistance. Her UC-Davis postdoc work focused on grower-driven research in soil-borne fungal plant pathogens. Her research is centered on soil-borne fungi causing crop diseases. She wants to understand the ecology and epidemiology of soil-associated fungi and oomycetes and enhance crop disease resistance.
